

The Holy Father's hope is that the experience of this unique worldwide opportunity will bring about a new springtime for listening, discernment, dialogue and decision-making in our Church, so that the whole People of God can better journey together with one another and the entire human family, under the guidance of the Holy Spirit. The Diocesan Synod Team encourages every parish to participate in the Diocese of Scranton's online survey.
