REFRESHMENT STAND

- Rose Ignatovich indicated that we will have to purchase soda this year and she will look for name brand sodas at
 discounted prices until the picnic. Megan Nebzydoski will look at Sams Club for deals. Carol Kneier will also look
 at Weis Market for sales.
- 7 cases of water a generally donated
- It was discussed that coolers of water should be available for volunteers. Rose will see if the donation will increase the number of cases to cover this
- The stand will remain open until 7:00 pm

TENTS & 50/50 TICKET SALES

- A correction was made to last months minutes. Last year we rented (2) 20' x 30' tents and (3) 20' x 20' for a total of 2,400 Sq. Ft. not 3,000 Sq. Ft. A new contract will be drawn up for the 40' x 80' tent (3,200 Sq. Ft.)

FINDERS MARKET

- Deb Biondo reported that the market is off to a good start with donations from the Red Cross Pharmacy in Forest City that closed its doors, a Church Sale in Honesdale and several individual donations.
- Chrisine Philips will chair the outdoor furniture/book sale tent. Greeting cards from the Red Cross Pharmacy will also be sold here.
- It was suggested that future sale or half price sale dates be established prior to the picnic.
- Sandi Komar asked if the market could stay open later. Deb Biondo said it was too much extra time and volunteers for only a few sales, as in past years, generally by 4:30, it has wound down.
